Breeder's Responsibility

- To maintain a private record which shall contain full particulars of his/her breeding program (constitution section 18)
- The Canadian Sheep Breeder Association is incorporated under the Animal Pedigree act. All breeders of registered stock must comply with this Act. Incorporated June 14, 1900 (constitution article 25.2)
- When selling a purebred animal the seller must provide the animal's duly transferred certificate of registration or certificate of identification to the buyer within 6 months of the sale date (constitution article 25.64(j))

Identification (Constitution) Article 16

- Breeder must apply to Canadian Livestock Records Corporation for identification letters for his/her exclusive use in tattooing sheep registered in the Canadian Sheep Breeder Association.
- Lambs must be identified within 100 days of birth by tattoo markings in the right ear, with the registered identification letters of the owner of the lambs at birth. Each lamb born shall be tattooed in the left ear with a different number, followed by the designated year letter used to signify the year of birth.
- Continued next page.

Identification (Constitution) Article 16

- A "Curl Lock" ear tag bearing identical information as the tattoos may be used as additional means of identification; this added means of identification must also be recorded on the registration paper.
- Year Letters: 'T' 2007, 'U' 2008, 'W' 2009 and so on. The letters 'I', 'O', 'Q', 'V' are never used as designating year letters.

Alternative Identification

As an alternative to tattooing a breeder may use a double tagging system with two tags approved and bearing the official identification number under the Canadian Sheep Identification Program. Lambs must be tagged within 48 hours of birth. In the event of a lost tag, the tag must be replaced with a duplicate tag bearing the same national I.D. number within 21 days.

Transfer and Duplicate Certificates

In the case of a sale of an animal, the seller must furnish a certificate of registration into the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation showing the purchaser's ownership. The transferred certificate must then be mailed to the buyer. Refusal to do so except under a written contract shall be grounds for expulsion from the association.

Eligibility for Registration

- Canadian bred and born- an animal whose sire and dam are of the same breed and are both Canadian registered and do not exhibit any disqualifying traits (article 21)



Resumed

- Keep records
- Identify animals by tattoo or double-tagging
- Not to offer any animals for sale as a purebred if the animal is not registered or eligible to be registered.
- Make arrangements and pay for transferring papers of sold animals.
- To supply transferred registrations to the new owners of the sold purebred within 6 months of purchase

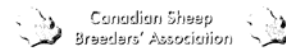

Annual membership in CSBA is \$30.00, plus applicable GST.





ASSOCIATION BREED STANDARDS

The following breed standards have been developed and endorsed by the Canadian Sheep Breeders' Association. They are intended to be used as a general guide in assessing true type for the major breeds in Canada.

There are some characteristics that are general to all breeds of sheep and they are outlined below. Characteristics specific to each breed are described on the following pages.

British Milk Sheep

CHARACTERISTICS COMMON TO ALL BREEDS

- All animals should demonstrate overall balance from the standpoint of length, height, body capacity and body conformation. Extremes in any of these areas may be objectionable for a variety of reasons.
- Overall balance is very important since the basic purpose of the sheep is meat and wool production and the purebred industry should be the foundation for breeding stock for both commercial and purebred sectors of the industry.
- Body conformation should exhibit adequate muscle development and wool production characteristics while maintaining ease of lambing.
- Teeth should meet upper pad evenly. Undershot or overshot mouths are a serious defect.
- Rams must have two testicles and ewes should have two teats.

SCORECARD

The following score card can be used as a guide in judging or evaluating purebred breeding stock. This is a guide for evaluation of physical appearance; however, in the process of selecting breeding stock other factors are also important such as performance data, extended pedigree, etc.

NORTH COUNTRY CHEVIOT

General Appearance:

-Medium sized, deep bodied sheep

-Mature body weight: Rams 100-125 kg Ewes 55-80 kg

Head:

-Moderately long, Roman to slightly Roman nose

-Covered with short glossy white hair

-Nostrils preferably black

-Hornless

-Occasional small dark spots on head and ears permitted

-Alert and erect ears

Neck:

-Strong, medium length, blending smoothly into shoulders

Shoulders:

-Good width between shoulder blades

-Even to slightly higher than back line

-Muscular forearm bulge on rams

Chest:

-Deep and broad

Back, Loin and Rump:

-Back strong, level (shoulders slightly higher) full, long, wide and well fleshed

-Rump level and carrying well out to dock

-Muscular in the shank region

Feet and Legs:


- Legs squarely placed, medium length in proportion to size
- Good bone, short white hair below wool line
- Strong pasterns
- Hooves black

Fleece:

- Light shrinking white, good staple, free of curl, hair or kemp
- Not hard
- 1/4 to 3/8 blood

Serious Defects:

- Pink nose
- Brown hair on legs or face
- Wool between ears
- More than three grades of wool in one fleece
- Black spots in wool
- Excessive folds on neck and shoulder
- Splayed hooves
- Excess kemp




What is CLRC

- Canadian Livestock Records Corporation is the national pedigree service for purebred and non-purebred livestock in Canada.
- We are a private non-profit organization that has been serving the Canadian livestock industry continuously since 1905. The organization is incorporated under the Animal Pedigree Act, which is federal legislation that regulates the keeping of all animal pedigree records in Canada.

- The various breed associations are also incorporated under the same Act, and any association so incorporated may become a member of CLRC. There are approximately fifty member associations for which records are being maintained.
- CLRC is governed by a Board of seven directors, six of whom are elected by the member association representatives, and one of whom is appointed by the Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food. The Board elects a chairman annually from among the Directors. Day to day operation of the records office is the responsibility of the General Manager.

CLRC is financed by charging for work performed. Registrations and all related functions are charged to associations on a unit cost system. One unit is defined as a standard two generation pedigree. The registration fee that breeders pay is set by the association. The difference in these two costs is a major source of revenue for associations in order that they may finance their many activities.

DIRECTIONS FOR TATTOOING

The success in securing a lasting tattoo mark depends entirely upon the operator.

A few simple rules must be observed:

- Halter or muzzle the animal, if necessary.
- Cleanse the area to be tattooed, using a cloth dampened with a cleansing fluid such as alcohol to remove dirt, grease and wax.
- Insert the correct symbols in the pliers and press down very firmly over the needles a thin rubber sponge pad. This pad helps to release the needles from the Skin.
- Check the correctness of the symbols by making a mark on a piece of paper.
- Smear ink on the needles and on the skin, choosing an area free from freckles and warts if possible. Place the symbols parallel to and between the veins or cartilaginous ridges of the ear. The accidental piercing of a vein may spoil the tattoo.
- Make the imprints with a quick firm movement and immediately apply a further amount of ink from the container on the ear and rub vigorously and continuously for at least fifteen seconds to ensure penetration. This is very important. The most effective method is to rub thumb and forefinger, though a brush may be used.
- Remove the rubber pad and rinse it and the needles in water, then dry. The sponge rubber pad should be discarded when it begins to lose its elasticity. The brush, if one used, should also be rinsed.
- Do not disturb the area until the healing process is complete, which may be from 5 days to 21 days, depending on the age of the animal.
- Keep a list of tattoo numbers with name of animals and enter same in your private breeding record.
