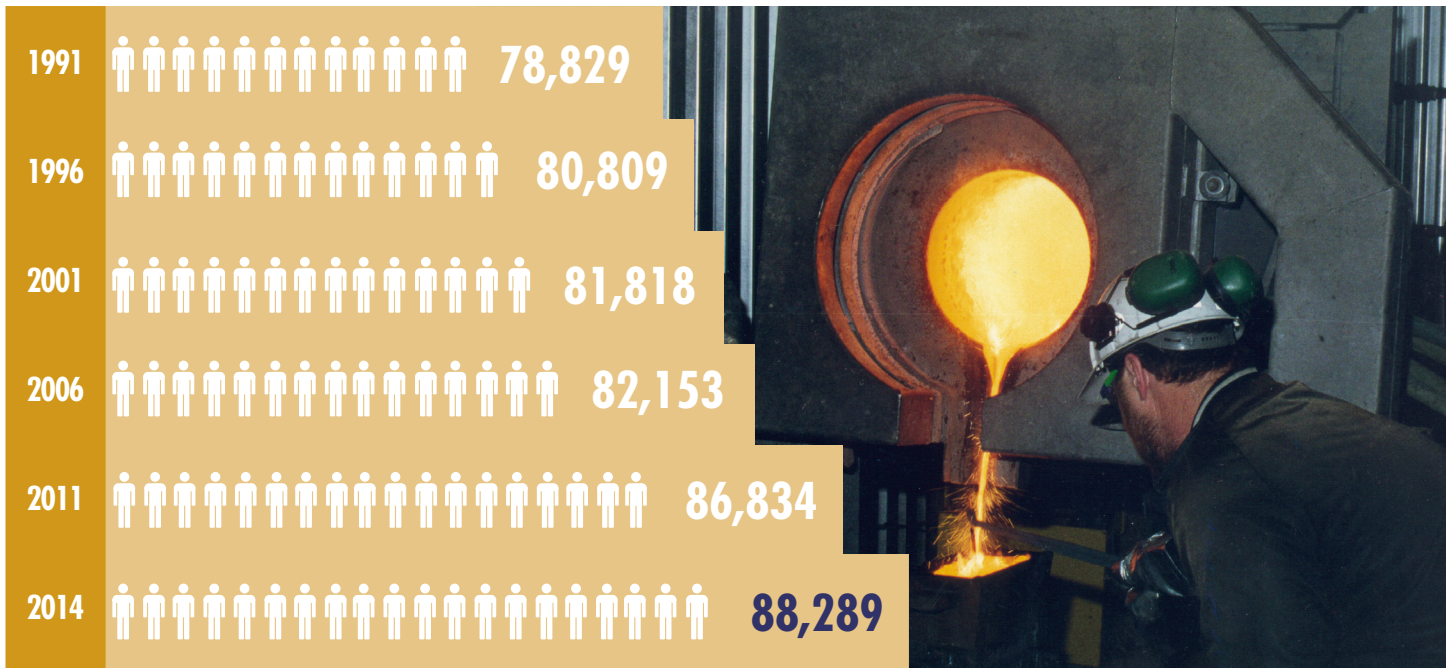

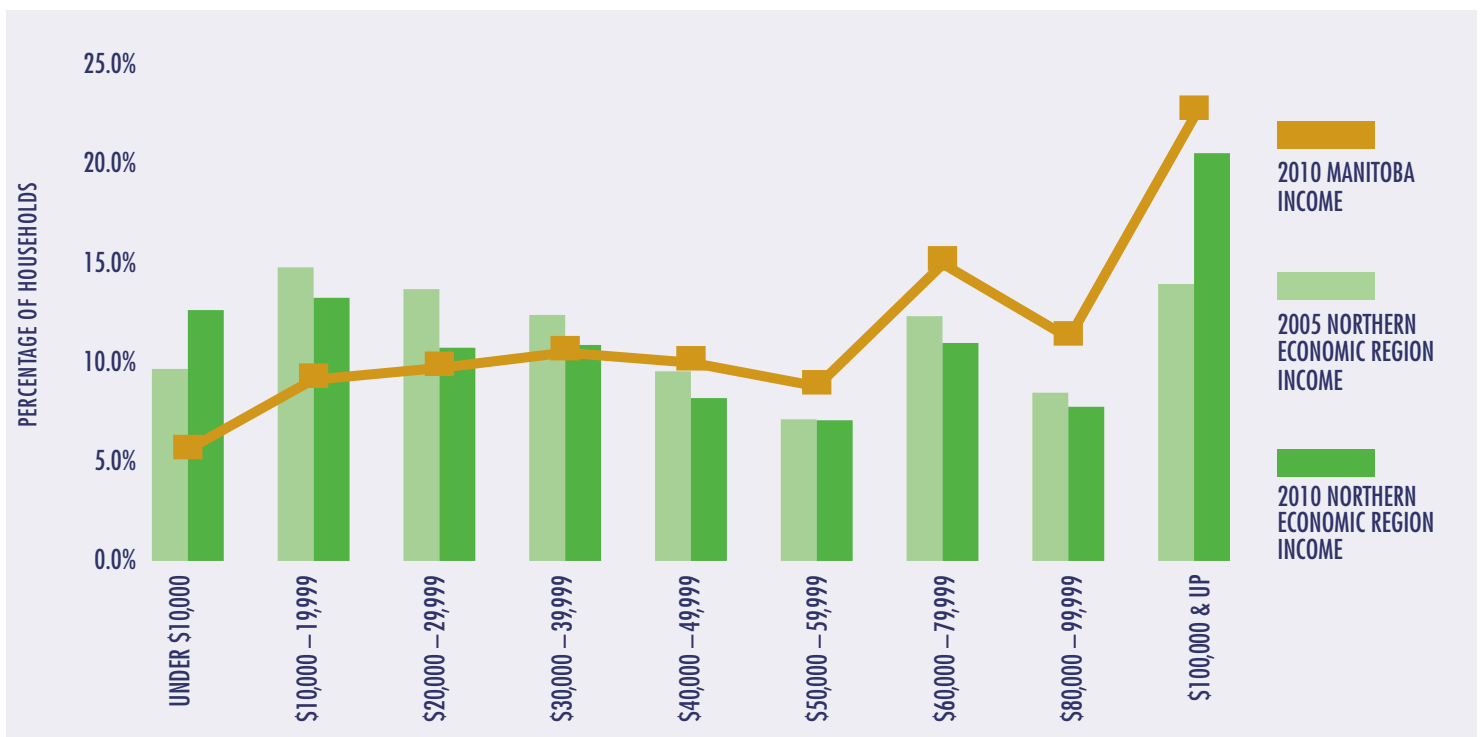
POPULATION GROWTH

 74.5% OF THE POPULATION IN THE REGION SELF-IDENTIFY AS INDIGENOUS.**



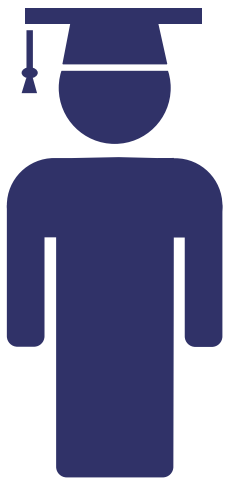

INCOME HOUSEHOLD INCOME OF PRIVATE HOUSEHOLDS IN 2005 AND 2010



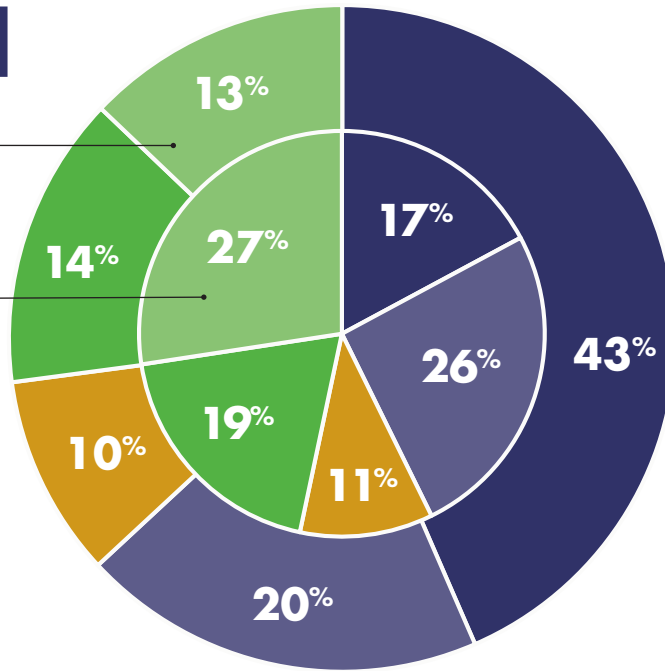

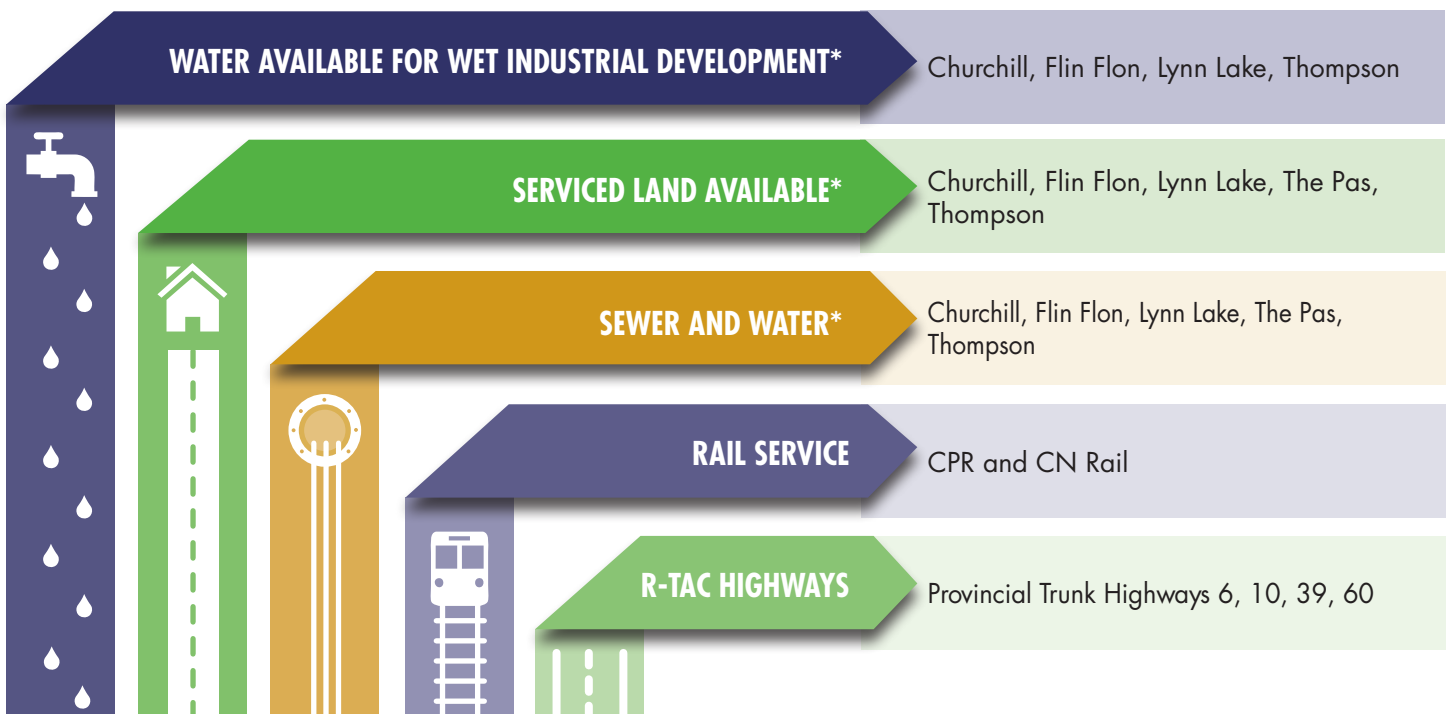
Ages 25-64 years
