

COVID-19 DOSE DELIVERY SCHEDULE






As of May 04, 2021.

Pfizer shipments increase to 73,710 doses each week from the week of May 3, and further ramp up to 87,750 doses each week from the week of May 31 to June 28 Janssen shipment of 10,900 doses for the week of May 3 is delayed, expected arrive in the following week.



Allocated data, not administered As of May 04




IMMUNIZATION FORECAST SCENARIO


Immunizers, Observers and Clinical Leads

- 3,052 hired, assigned or trained:
 - 1,578 Shared Health
 - 1,021 regional health authorities
 - 453 partners / trained only
- The goal has been to broaden the number of professions that can administer vaccines
- This limits the impacts on the health care system
- Nurses account for 40 percent of this workforce. The total complement is an inter-disciplinary team with a variety of trained professionals

Retention

Town halls

- Monthly virtual town halls are offered to all employees.
- Opportunity for staff to engage with leadership and learn about issues like vaccine supply and cultural safety in the context of their work.

Engagement

 Regular communications with vaccination clinic staff, including the weekly Manitoba Vaccine Team News.

Term positions

- Additional term navigator and student immunizer positions are being offered.
- Will provide stability as we move into the summer months.

Hiring to Match Vaccine Campaign Ramp-up

- Thousands of applications received to date
- After the original influx of resumes, the focus on hiring for particular communities and positions.
- Everyone who has applied will get a response: nearly 3,000 immunizer and navigator candidates

- This is being led by the province with support from Shared Health and human resources staff from the City of Winnipeg
- We are anticipating a large increase in staff over the month of May as a result of these efforts



Support for Urban Indigenous Clinic Staffing

- There are five clinics in Brandon, Thompson, Portage and two in Winnipeg.
- Non-clinical staffing (site managers, security, liaisons, outreach workers)
 are being funded through a grant
- Clinical staff (clinic lead, observers, immunizers) are being provided by RHAs/Shared Health
- Funding for navigators is in place for the two clinics in Winnipeg and Manitoba is providing navigator staffing support in others

NEXT STEPS

Expanding Eligibility

- Community-based eligibility expansions are complete
- Returning to age-based eligibility starting today
- People aged 45 or older can bookbeginning at 11:45 am.
- Will continue expanding eligibility regularly (Monday / Wednesday / Friday) based on age, as vaccine supplies and available appointments allow

All people aged 18+ will be eligible by May 21



NEXT STEPS

Plans for 2nd Doses

- 2nd dose appointments will begin
 being booked once first dose
 eligibility is complete
- People will be notified by:
 - government announcements
 - web / social media updates
 - direct outreach with information provided to us, including phone numbers, emails, texts

- First groups eligible to book their 2nd dose will be people who are immunocompromised or have specific priority medical conditions
- Eligibility will then be expanded based on when a person received their first dose
