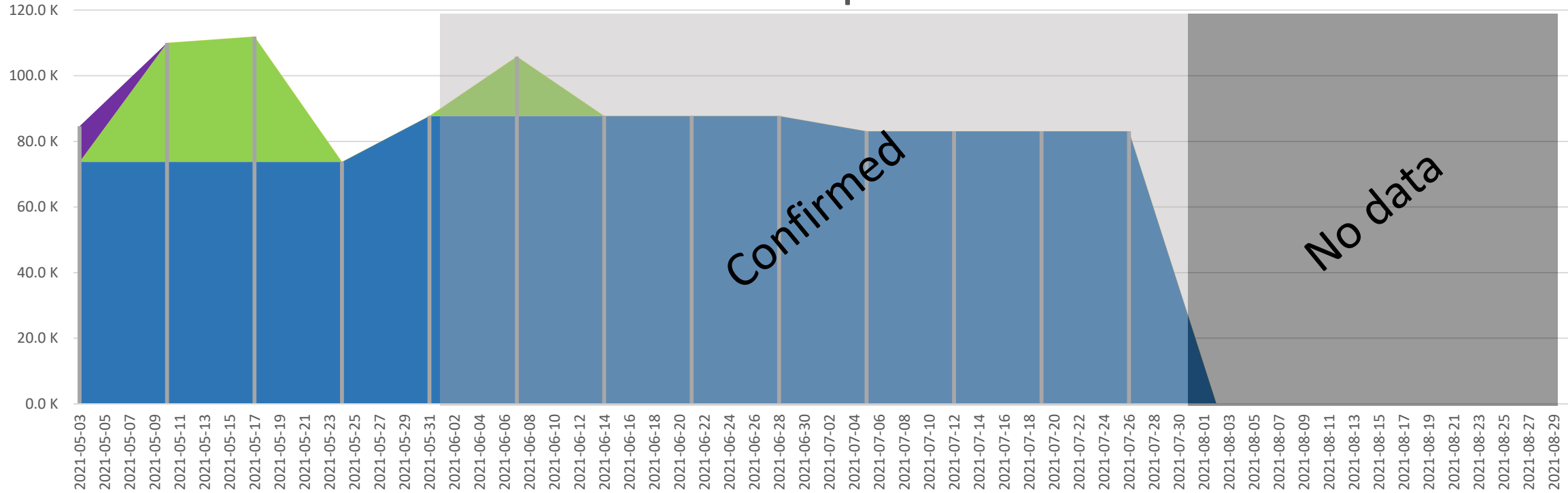

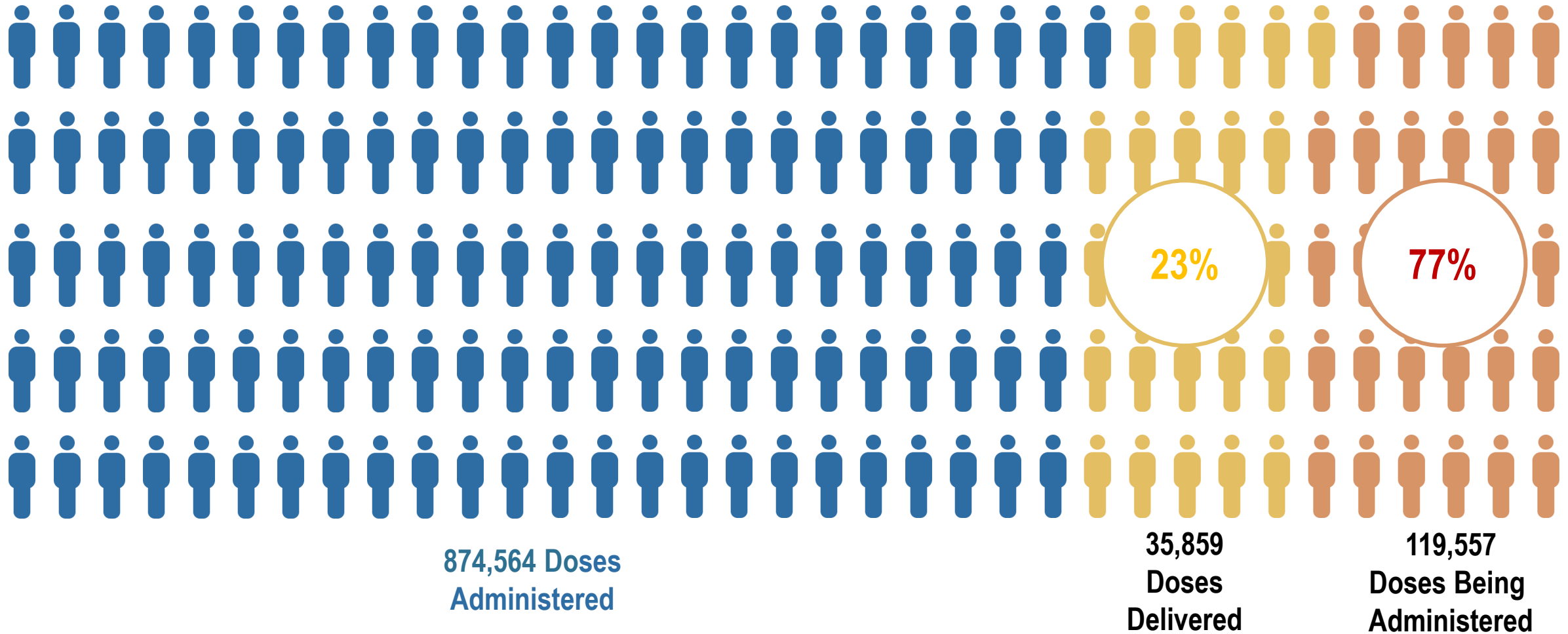

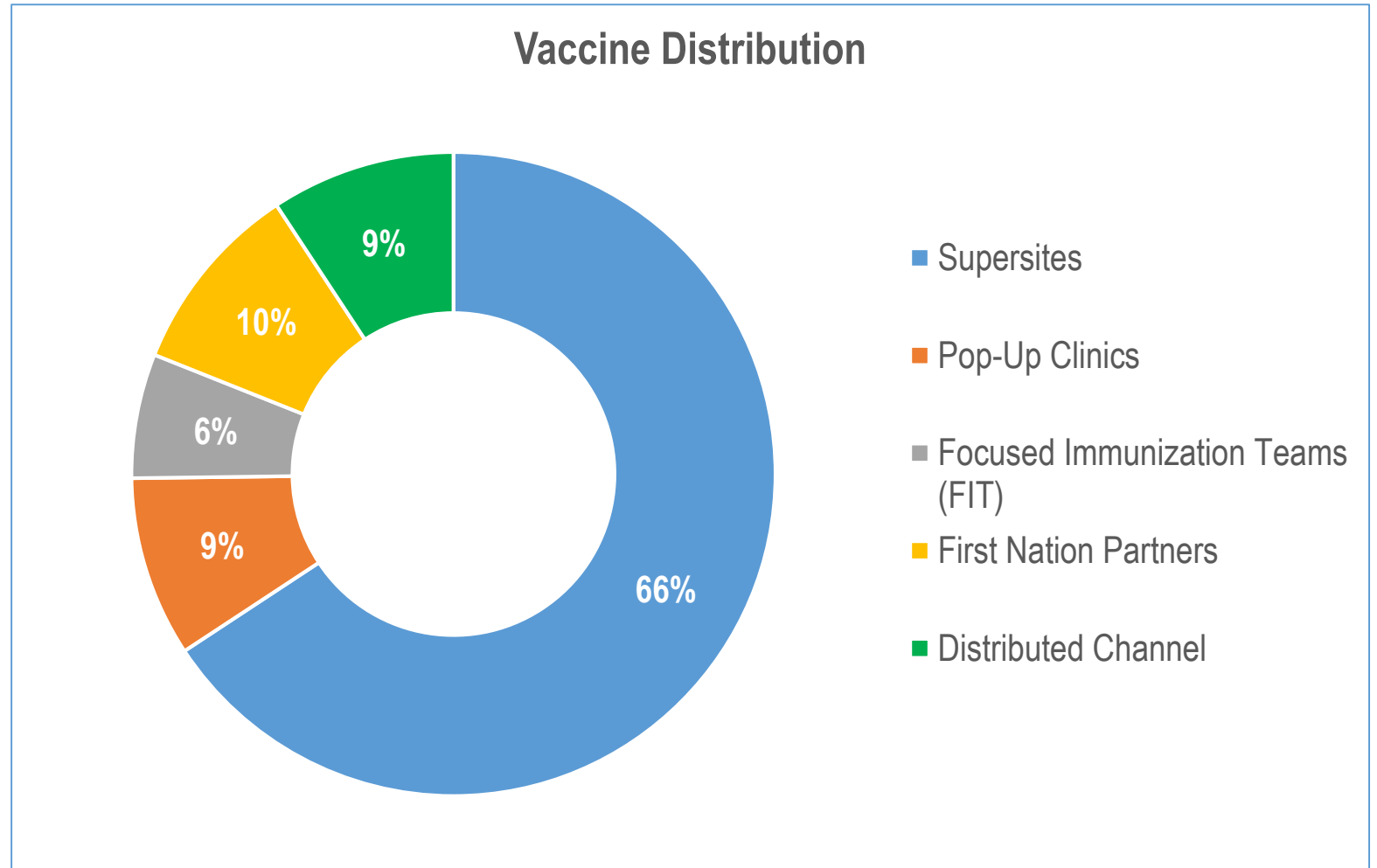

Where Manitoba's Doses Have Gone



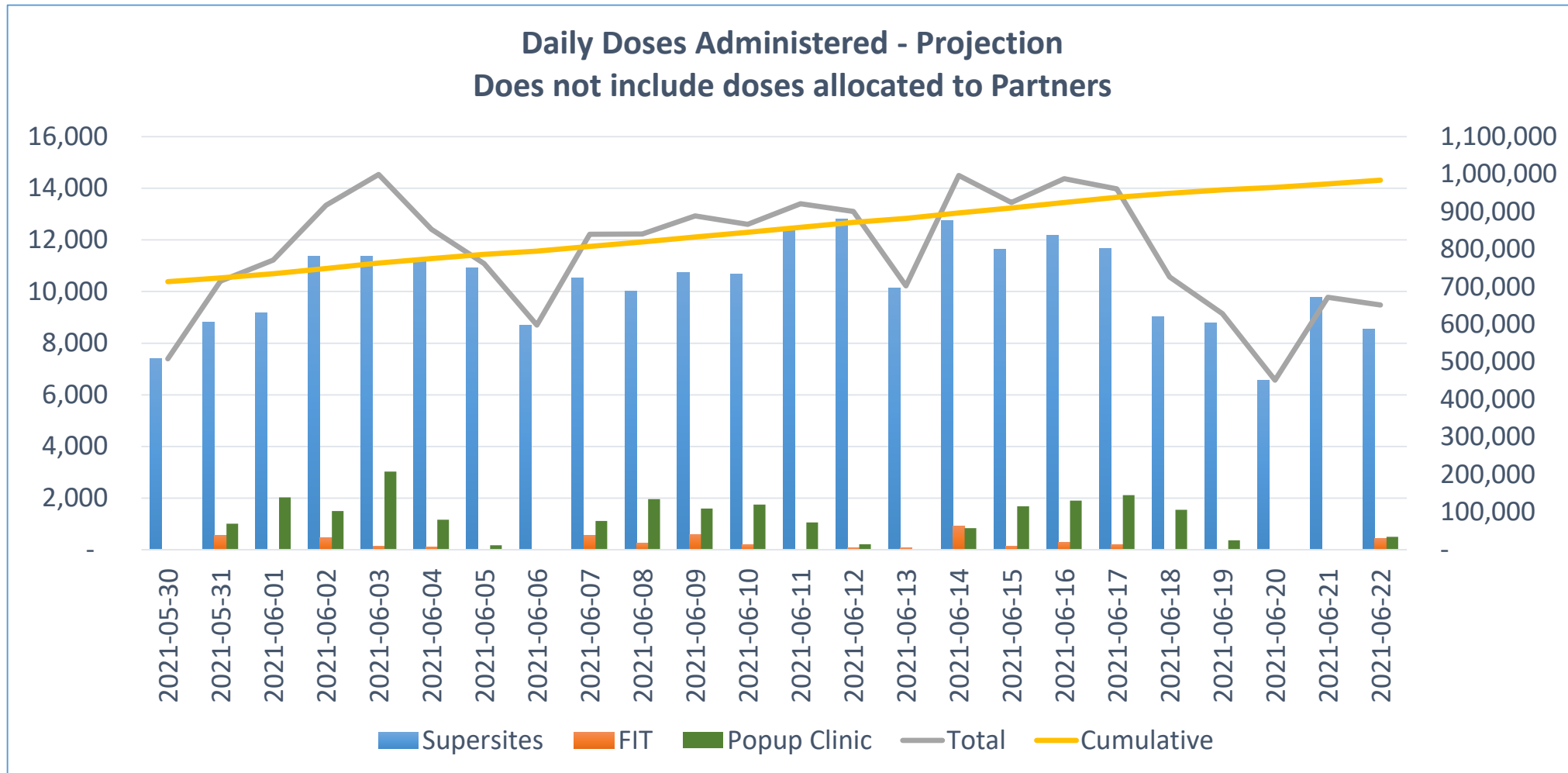

IMMUNIZATION FORECAST SCENARIO

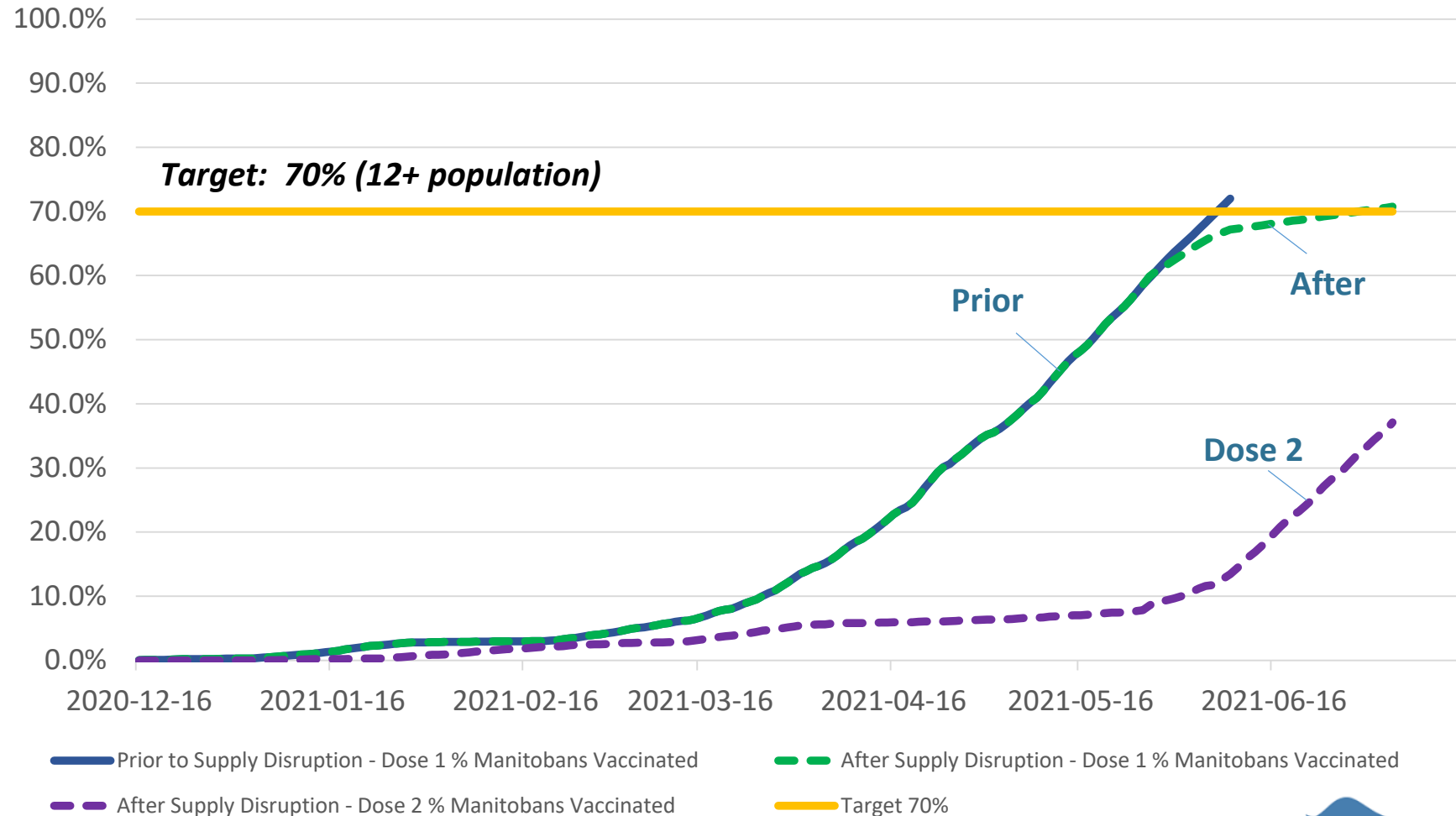

VACCINE ACCESS



Pop-up Clinics

- Continuing to balance speed with equitable access to vaccine
- Provides geographic accessibility
- Will continue and expand to new locations
- Improves accessibility by increasing immunization options closer to home for those where travel to the nearest supersite is a barrier to immunization
- Includes mobile clinics starting this week

VACCINE ACCESS



Community-hosted clinics

- Working with community organizations who have trust & expertise
- Facilitating other community-based and community-led options
- Community organization/business does community outreach, hosts the clinic, assist with site set up and volunteers when available. Clinical team provides the immunization services

VACCINE ACCESS



Independent Immunization Partners

- This will shift approach in some sites from FITs to mirroring other immunization campaigns, like seasonal flu:
 - hospitals
 - personal care homes
 - correctional facilities
 - health care facility occupational and environmental safety and health teams
 - home care
- They will be able to order and administer vaccine based on their needs. More details on this process being shared with sites soon.
- Improves accessibility by more timely administration of vaccine by sites
- Includes home visits for those who are unable to leave their home

VACCINE ACCESS



Distributed Channel

- This week, about 25 medical clinics and pharmacies will receive about 5,000 mRNA vaccines – Pfizer & Moderna
- Can be used for first or second doses
- A weekly allocation will continue to be available to all participating partners (500+ sites)
- Locations and amount of vaccine may vary
- Will help improve access for communities facing barriers by having vaccine in known and trusted locations and by a trusted provider
