'William Corston (b) now sent on board the vessel  $\{\underline{Mink}\}$  had been discharged on account of bad health. I would thank you to see that he gets a passage to Eastmain River…' (B.186/c/2, fo. 134)

McTavish, in a letter to William Corston (a) dated 18 July 1881 from Rupert House, stated:

'Your son William has been discharged on account of ill health, I now forward him to Eastmain River..' (B.186/b/71, fo. 707)
