## Manitoba HIV Medications Program (MHMP)

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) – Health Professionals May 30, 2024

- 1. Is coverage of more frequent dispensing (i.e., more than one professional fee per medication per month) available under MHMP?

  - a. Does my pharmacy need to request a new FOD approval for coverage through MHMP (i.e., if we already have a current FOD approval for a client in place)?
    - No. Existing FOD approvals for HIV medications remain in place under MHMP for the duration of the approval period (if applicable).
- 2. If I have issues submitting claims under the new Public Health carrier code as of June 3, 2024, who should I contact?
  - Pharmacy may contact the DPIN Helpdesk at 204-786-8000 or toll free at 1-800-663-7774, selecting option 2.
  - Pharmacies using Assyst Rx, the legacy Telus platform, may be directed to contact their vendor support helpdesk to add a client to new carrier code in their software.
  - Independent (non-chain) pharmacies using Kroll may also wish to review the "How to Add the Plan" document their pharmacy software vendor provided them.
- 3. How should my pharmacy document client responses regarding self-declaration of coverage under a federal drug plan or another provincial drug plan? Has this been built into DPIN?
  - Pharmacies may determine how to best implement this documentation requirement. This functionality cannot be built into DPIN.
- 4. Are new Exception Drug Status (EDS) applications required for EDS benefits covered under MHMP?
  - Clients must have current EDS approval on file for EDS benefit HIV medications to be covered under MHMP. If a client has EDS approval on file already (for example, through previous coverage of their HIV medications through Pharmacare), the existing approval will be transferred to the client's profile under MHMP.
- 5. Do prescribers need to register to prescribe HIV PrEP?
  - No. With the implementation of MHMP, there is no longer a requirement to register as a PrEP prescriber. Prescribers are still expected to:
    - Be familiar with Manitoba's <u>Eligibility Criteria and Clinical Guidance for Manitoba</u> <u>HIV PrEP</u> document and the Manitoba HIV Program's <u>HIV Prevention</u>
       Guidelines prior to prescribing PrEP.
    - Ensure that each client meets the eligibility criteria for PrEP established in the Manitoba Drug Benefits Formulary.
    - Schedule ongoing follow-up for monitoring and counseling as outlined in the HIV Prevention Guidelines.
