2. Purpose

The Public Health Information Management System (PHIMS) securely manages and protects Personal Health Information (PHI) in compliance with the Personal Health Information Act (PHIA) and the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA).

These guidelines are intended to ensure that authorized organizations have controlled access to relevant data necessary for fulfilling their public health responsibilities, while adhering to strict privacy and confidentiality standards outlined by Manitoba legislation. Access to PHIMS is role-based, ensuring that users only have access to information pertinent to their designated responsibilities and region, thereby safeguarding sensitive data from unauthorized disclosure.



3. Scope

These guidelines are designed to assist authorized organizations in assigning user roles that:

- An Authorized User is qualified to fulfill.
 - E.g., A public health nurse cannot be assigned the medical officer of health role.
- Limit the number of users who access more sensitive information.
 - User Roles that can access more sensitive PHI (e.g. communicable diseases) and roles where Standard Reports may have data sensitivities such as:
 - Aggregate data with small populations
 - Explicitly identifiable personal data

4. Definitions

Authorized Organizations	An organization or entity with whom Manitoba has entered into an agreement in order to facilitate access to the PHIMS Shared Service by that organization's or entity's employees, agents or contractors for an authorized purpose. For example: Regional Health Authorities, First Nations Inuit Health Branch (Indigenous Services Canada), First Nation communities, Shared Health and other health care providing organizations. [1]
Authorized User	A designated representative of the Authorized Organization permitted to access, use or disclose Information in the PHIMS application under the terms and conditions of the Information Sharing Agreement. [1]



User Roles	The specific role or roles to which an Authorized User is assigned and which prescribes what Information the Authorized User is permitted to access, use and disclose.[1]
Logged-in Organization	Authorized Users may be limited to producing and viewing reports that include only PHI of clients or data from their own region
Registered Nurse	A title protected by the College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba. [2] Public Health Nurses are Registered Nurses whose clinical practice mainly includes Public Health services. In some communities, there are designated Public Health Nurses who deliver public health services; in other communities, Registered Nurses provide the public health services in conjunction with other health care services.
Epidemiology	The study of the distribution and determinants of health-related states or events (including disease), and the application of this study to the control of diseases and other health problems. Various methods can be used to carry out epidemiological investigations: surveillance and descriptive studies can be used to study distribution; analytical studies are used to study determinants. [3]
