Mr. SANTOS, Chairperson of the Committee of Supply, presented the Report of the Proceedings of the Committee of May 3, 2001 as follows:

10.1 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding FOUR MILLION, NINE THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS for INDUSTRY, TRADE AND MINES:

10.5 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding FIFTEEN MILLION, NINETY-THREE THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS for INDUSTRY, TRADE AND MINES:

MANITOBA RESEARCH, INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY \$15,093,100.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2002.

10.6 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-SIX THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED DOLLARS for INDUSTRY, TRADE AND MINES:

AMORTIZATION OF CAPITAL ASSETS..... \$526,700.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2002.
