### Mr. NESBITT – The Potato's Significant Impact on Manitoba's Heritage and Economy

13. WHEREAS Manitoba has a long history of commercial potato farming dating back to 1908; and

WHEREAS Manitoba harvests thousands of acres of potatoes today, as new markets have been developed across Canada and into the United States and Mexico; and

WHEREAS currently there are over 24 varieties of potatoes grown in Manitoba; and

WHEREAS this industry is directly responsible for a significant portion of agricultural production in Manitoba; and

WHEREAS Manitoba has large areas of land suitable for potato production and the potential for expanding the processing industry; and

WHEREAS Manitoba's potato industry is growing and could soon become the perennial largest potato producer in Canada.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba urge the Provincial Government to acknowledge the important role of Manitoba's potato industry in the Provincial economy.

### **DEBATE ON GOVERNMENT RESOLUTION:**

## Hon. Mr. CULLEN - Trans-Pacific Partnership

WHEREAS Manitoba's exports to Trans-Pacific Partnership countries averaged more than \$9 billion annually from 2012 to 2014; and

WHEREAS the Trans-Pacific Partnership will support economic growth and job creation by eliminating tariffs on almost all of Manitoba's key exports while providing access to new opportunities in the Asia-Pacific region; and

WHEREAS exclusion from the Trans-Pacific Partnership would close access to critical trade markets and put Manitoba jobs at risk.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba confirm its support for the Trans-Pacific Partnership and call on the Federal Government to take the necessary actions to ratify the agreement.
