

Campground Tips

- Be Wildlife Smart. Do not feed any wildlife, including birds or squirrels. You are in black bear country - secure all attractants such as food, cooking equipment and trash in a locked vehicle. Do not store food or attractants in your tent.
- Practice Leave No Trace. Pack out all gear and trash to keep the campsites clean for others.
- Keep dogs on leash and clean up after your pet.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- Open fires are prohibited. Use portable stoves or fire pits provided.
- Don't Move Firewood - Moving firewood can spread harmful invasive species and destroy our forests.
- Prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Always clean, drain, dry watercraft and water related equipment. Visit manitoba.ca/stopais for full regulations.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Park Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.

- Discover the simple pleasures in this family vacation spot



Located beside Stephenfield Lake, this large campground is a great place for a family vacation.

Choose from six bays of sites offering basic, electrical, or water and electrical service. Group campsites are also offered along with six yurts. Picnic shelters and tables provide convenience while horseshoe pitches, basketball nets and a baseball diamond add to the fun. Explore the hiking trail that surrounds the park and passes through the campground.

Stephenfield Dam is a major point of interest in the area. At the shores of the reservoir, you'll find swimming fishing and boating.

A playground is located near the unsupervised swimming area.

For a day on the links; Carman, Miami and Roland golf courses are close by.

Leaving Winnipeg, travel west 62 kilometres on Highway # 3 to Carman, continue west on Provincial Road 245, 22 kilometres, turn right at the park signs.
